# ABSTRACT OF ACADEMIC REGULATIONS

## Semester

All programmes in the college shall adopt a Semester system. There will be two semesters in an academic year. Normally the Fall Semester will be from June/July to November and Winter Semester from December/January to May. Optional Weekend Intra Semester and Summer Semesters, during the weekends of both the regular semesters (Fall and Winter) and Summer vacation periods respectively, may be offered considering the demand for such courses by students in need, subject to the availability of time, faculty and other resources. Both weekends Intra and summer semesters are offered under a fast track mode, considering the less number of instructional days available during weekends and summer vacation periods. However, the number of instructional hours needed to cover the syllabi shall be maintained (equivalent to that in the regular semester) with more number of instruction hours per week. Unless otherwise specified explicitly, all rules and regulations applicable to a course offered during a regular semester is applicable to the courses offered during weekend and summer semesters also. The maximum number of courses to be taken, eligibility criteria to register and related information shall be specified through Circulars issued by the University from time to time.

## Curriculum

Each programme contains a prescribed list of courses in a specific format which is generally called "Curriculum". Curriculum of a programme contains list of courses grouped under various heads, viz. Multi -Discipline Courses, Telugu Language Course, Skill Enhancement Courses, Value Added Courses, English Language Courses, Major Courses, Minor Courses, Project and Internship.

### Details of these heads are given

A student is considered to have completed the degree programme, if and only if, he/she has successfully cleared/ completed all the necessary courses prescribed in his/her programme curriculum. Each programme Curriculum shall have a version number tagged to the Academic Year to which it is applicable and subsequent changes in the Curriculum shall be indicated by a change in

curriculum version number appropriately. Students admitted into a programme shall adopt a curriculum specified by the S.V University for that academic year. Unless otherwise stated explicitly by the University BOS, any changes in curriculum will be applicable to the students admitted in the subsequent year and the existing batches continue to follow the curriculum prescribed at the time of their joining the programme. Each In charge of the Department looks after one or more programmes and hence In charge is deemed to be responsible for the curriculum.

### **Syllabus**

A course syllabus is a document that explains what a student is going to learn in that course. Each syllabus for a course shall have a course code, course title, syllabus revision number (version), course objectives, expected course outcomes (COs), modules with short topics, brief description of the topics, expected duration needed to cover each module, suggested text and reference books etc. Once approved by the university, it is mandatory for the lecturer to teach the course as specified in the syllabus in total.

### **Course Plan**

A course plan consists of a list of lectures/ experiments carried out in each instructional class/ lab by the course teacher during the semester as per the course, with details like mode of delivery, reference material used, and others. One credit in a course requires, 15 lecture hours within the regular semester period as specified in the Academic Calendar of the University. Separate course plans need to be prepared for the theory/laboratory of any course. Lab exercises and projects given to students should reflect the syllabus content of the course.

### **Course Flowchart**

A flowchart describing how various courses under Multi -Discipline Courses, Telugu Language Course, Skill Enhancement Courses, Value Added Courses, English Language Courses, Major Courses, Minor Courses, Project and Internship are connected through prerequisites, if any, shall be shown and made part of the curriculum. Standard pictorial representations are adopted to indicate the basket it belongs to and grouped in such a way to indicate its proposed semester of offering.

## **Course Types**

Courses may be classified as Theory only, Lab only, Theory and Lab embedded courses. Certain courses like Summer Internships, are grouped under "Project and Internship".

## **Academic Regulations**

Courses taught through traditional classroom methods are categorized under Class Based Learning (CBL). Introduction of more project courses is to improve 'learning by doing' and also to increase the academic engagement of students. For Project course, the student has to take up a project related to the course in consultation with the faculty concerned and complete the project. The project can be a group project with a maximum of five members in a group. The size will reflect the complexity of the project. Students should make sure that the concepts studied are reflected in the project and that there is an innovative component.

## **Course code**

Each course will be identified by a unique Course Code

## **Programme Duration**

The minimum duration that the students are generally expected to take to meet various requirements of programmes offered by the University is 3 Years. A student is said to have completed the programme only if he / she completes the minimum courses assigned and earns credit requirements as specified in their programme curriculum concerned. However, degree will be awarded only upon the completion of the minimum duration of the programme as prescribed by UGC.. Students will not be permitted to study additional courses except under Minors/Honours after they have met their curriculum requirements.

## **Course and Credit requirements**

This section outlines the structure of the curriculum, courses and various requirements for programme completion. Course credit is a measurement of duration that the course is offered as an 'instruction' to students. All courses are considered to be offered for the entire duration of a semester. A semester is deemed to have 15 instructional (non-exam) weeks. A class room lecture (L) of 60 minutes duration per week, shall be considered as one Instructional Unit. A minimum of 120 minutes per week of laboratory session/ practical or field work/

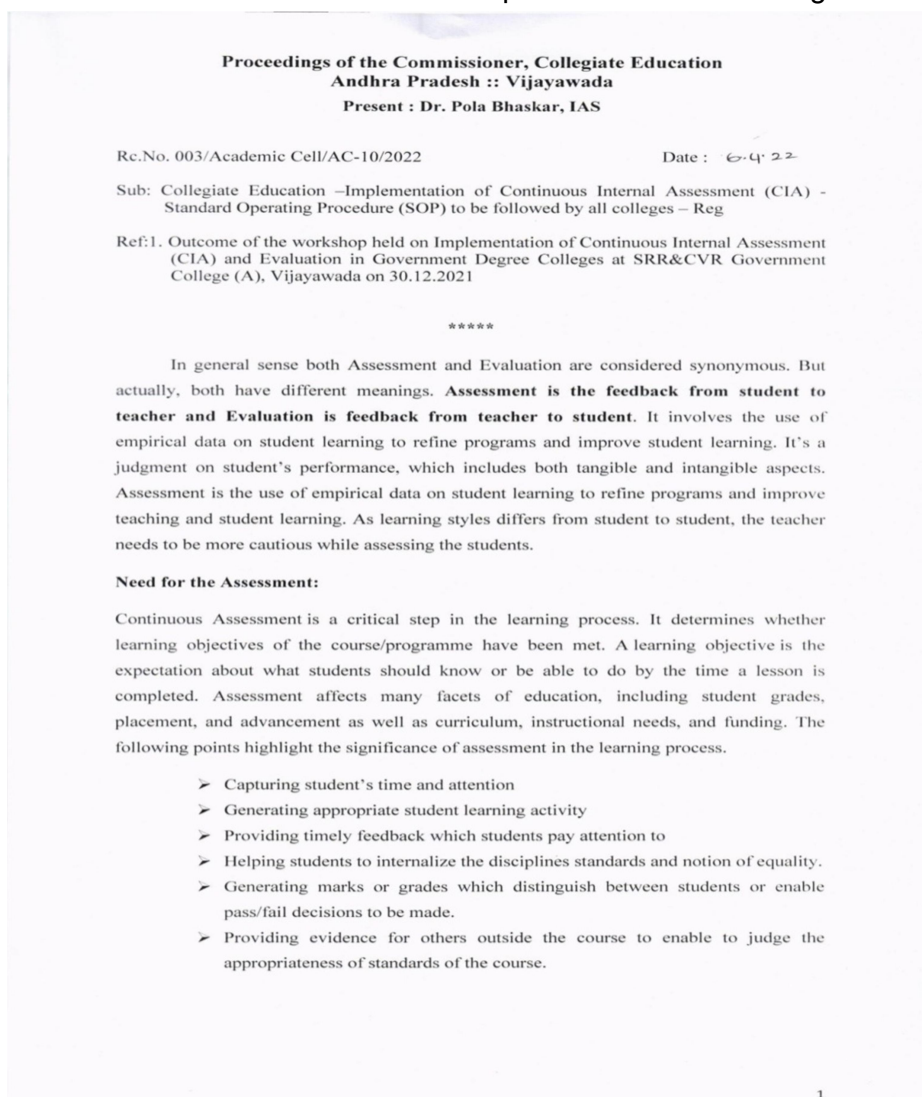
training (P) or a combination of these, carried out during all weeks of the semester, shall also be considered as one Demonstration Unit.

### Minimum Credit Requirement

The minimum credit requirement for the completion of a programme for students admitted is clearly specified in the programme curriculum. Further, the student has to meet the course and credit distribution under various heads as specified under as specified in the curriculum to become eligible for the degree. Due to various features, it is possible for a student to attain the minimum credit requirement without completing all requisite courses/credits under individual heads, Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC), Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC) and Project and Internship as defined in their curriculum to become eligible for the degree

### Assessment:

**External Assessment** for 75 marks is done in accordance with university procedure and for 25Marks **Internal Assessment** is done as per AP CCE Proceedings.





## COMPUTERLAB



Our College boasts two state-of-the-art computer science labs with nearly Fifty PCs. These labs serve the students of various backgrounds and faculty alike to solve complex problems, create advanced learning methods, and conduct research in science. The lab infrastructure offers a diverse range of hardware that powers open-source software platforms for students to appreciate the open source initiative and gain wide-ranging experience. The laboratories are fully furnished and have been thoughtfully designed to create a welcoming environment conducive to gaining technical knowledge.

All labs are powered by Linux-based workstations equipped with fast network connections using LAN and Wi-Fi Access Points. The workstations offer the latest software packages, including but not restricted to android studios, code blocks, eclipse, Jupyter, libre office suite, MySQL, etc., and also the language compilers, viz. gcc, java, swi-prolog, python3, R, etc. Furthermore, the labs offer in-lab teaching assistance using interactive Projectors for the hands-on learning experience. Hands on Practice to students and staff will be done by using these labs

# SCIENCE LABORATORIES

## Botany Lab



The Department has well-equipped laboratories, which encourage collaborative work and ensure that UG/PG/PhD students have ample opportunity for hands-on experience. The labs were well equipped with a wide range of analytical instruments like microscopes to carry out research in various areas such as Taxonomy of marine and freshwater algae, Systematic studies of Angiosperms, Environmental studies, Plant tissue culture, and related aspects, Reproductive Biology & Population genetics, Phytochemistry, Ethnobotany & Ethnopharmacology, Pharmacognosy etc.

## Chemistry Lab

The Chemistry Department has a well-equipped, well-maintained, spacious laboratory with all necessary infrastructures for graduate-level experiments. Safety rules are strictly followed in the lab and individual work space and storage space are allotted to students. Separate areas are provided for the chemical storage room, weighing room. Regular organic, inorganic, chromatographic and physical chemistry experiments and graduate-level projects are carried out in the laboratory.

Instrumental facilities in the lab include Laboratory : 2 Nos

Centrifuge, Conductometer, Digital colorimeter, Digital pH meter, Electronic Balance (3 digit), Hot air oven Magnetic stirrer with hot plate, Magnetic stirrers, Melting point apparatus, Polarimeter, Potentiometer, Water bath with concentric ring, Viscometer, Desktop, Printer.



## Zoology Lab



Zoology lab is well equipped with spotters. The Zoology Lab consists of wet specimens of invertebrates, vertebrates, slides, skeletal parts etc. We have equipment for sericulture and apiculture too. Students conduct dissections of prawn, cockroach, honeybee, earthworm etc. We have various scientific instruments like Colorimeter, PH meter, Centrifuge, Chromatographic instrument, Microtome etc. Staff & students of the College can make use of Weighing Machine to check their body weight, Sphygmomanometer to check Blood Pressure and can test their Blood groups also from Zoology Lab.

## Physics Lab

The Physics lab is spacious and well equipped with sophisticated instruments to perform all the experiments as prescribed by the university. The lab is fully equipped to provide an experimental foundation for the theoretical concepts introduced in-class lectures. Every academic year the lab instruments are upgraded as per necessary requirements. It also has a dark room for various optics experiments. The Physics laboratory includes facilities and equipment needed for:

- General Physics Lab
- Optics and Magnetism Lab

# THE LIBRARY

The College Library was established in 2008 to serve the academic and information needs of the users. The college library occupies a spacious room in the College. It is a user focused centre of learning resources that meets the academic and research needs. The library users has N-list Subscription. The library has a Reading Room with the seating capacity of 60 students and a collection of more than 4000 books on Commerce, English, Political Science, History, Zoology, Botany, Physics, Chemistry and Computer Science. It has subscription of periodicals/magazines (national and international) and 3 Newspapers (print form) in Telugu and English languages. The library provides access to a database of 98000 e-books and approximately 10000 e-journals through NLIST subscription. In addition to the NLIST facility the users can utilize the e-resources accessible through DULS (Delhi University Library System) through College Network and Remote Login facility.

It has an e-resource section wherein students and faculty members can have access to varied e-resources maintained by the library.

The library keeps record of the debates and discussions participated by faculty members on digital platforms.

To bring students closer to art, culture and history, the library has a wall of fame that showcases eminent personalities from diverse fields.

The library is equipped with newspaper stands for ease and comfort of reading. It is well equipped with fire extinguishers for safety. A suggestion box is also put up outside the library to welcome inputs and suggestions on library matters and to cater to the expectations of students and improve its functioning.

The Library remains open on all working days from 10.00 a.m. to 5.00 p.m. except (Sunday (s), and other gazette holidays).

## **Breach of Library Rules**

As the college library is a place of individual study, it is necessary to maintain an atmosphere of quiet and dignity inside the library. Talking and Smoking are strictly prohibited in the library. Any student, whose act or behavior is considered undesirable by the librarian, may be refused admission to the library.

## **Care of Books/ documents**

Library books are costly and often rare. They should be used and handled with care. Members shall not write upon, damage, tear down the leaves or make a mark upon any book. Before leaving the Library circulation counter, the member must satisfy

themselves whether the book lent to him/her, is in sound condition. If not, he/she shall immediately bring the matter to the notice of the librarian / library staff. Otherwise member shall be held responsible for any damage noticed/reported later or at the time of returning the books. A member shall be responsible for any loss or damage of the books or other document belonging to the library while under his/her use and shall be required to replace such books or documents. Penalty for book lost, damaged, mutilated or defaced by marking, shall be fixed by the Librarian.

### **Open Access**

The members have the privilege of direct access to shelves in the stack hall. It is important, that the arrangement of books is maintained on the shelves for the convenience of the members themselves. The books can be freely taken out but on no account the books should be re-shelved by the members because of the danger of their misplacement.

The placement Cell, in the college is very important. It conducts placement activities in the college. In 2024 more than 50 students are selected to various companies organized by placement cell. Placement cell in collaboration with APSSDC conducts placement drives.

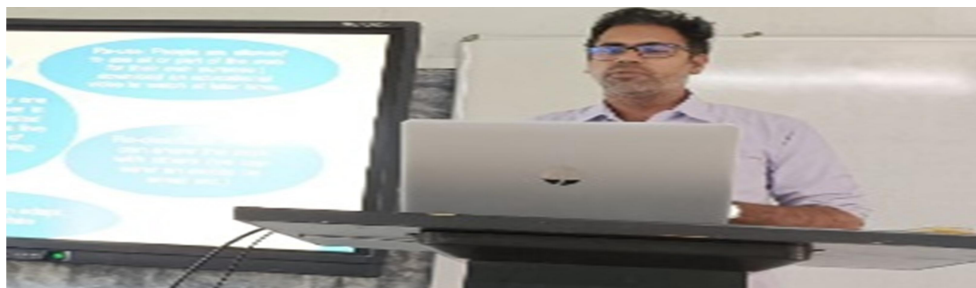


# NSS AND CULTURALS

## DISCIPLINE AT COLLEGE

1. Students are to contribute to the high standard of the college by their manners and general good behavior. Hence, for the smooth running of the college, no student should bring to college any object liable to prove a source of disturbance.
2. As far as posture, cleanliness, Silence, politeness, companions are concerned, the college should be looked upon as place of reverence and discipline.
3. Absolute silence must be maintained at all places during the teaching hours, especially computer room, the general assembly or on the way to and from the classrooms.
4. Respect for one's property as well as for that of the college and for the things belonging to others is a mark of a well-bred and responsible student. Furniture, teaching aids and charts should be kept in their respective places after use. Any kind of damage done in the college premises must be compensated.
5. It is compulsory to speak English in the college premises in order to facilitate the students the use the medium of instruction. They should maintain a high standard in their conversation.
6. No mobiles, other books, news papers, periodicals, pictures, games articles, transistors or any electrical instruments not pertaining to their daily use, should be brought to college without the class teacher's/Principal's permission. If detected or found to have bad influence on the fellow students, these will be confiscated and students found guilty may be punished.
7. The college does not accept responsibility for the loss of books, money, stationery etc. Each student is responsible for his/her own things. Bringing of valuables like gold to the college is not permitted.
8. The principal may chastise a student for habitual idleness, disobedience or misconduct which are injurious to the moral tone of the college, by detention after class hours or by other works. He may even dismiss a student or ask him to discontinue if he is guilty of serious matters.
9. No fines or collection for any purpose what-so-ever may be made without the previous sanction of the Principal, so also presentation of gifts to members of the staff requires previous sanction
10. In the absence of the teachers the class monitors/ monitors assumes responsibility for order and discipline of the class. She/he should fulfill his/her duty with loyalty and impartiality.

11. Students who are given responsibility should carry it out dutifully and impartially and in accordance with the discretion of the Principal or the teacher deputed by him. They should consider it as a service to the college and to their fellow students.

12. Students can always approach the Principal individually for any reasonable or sympathetic consideration and not collectively.

13. No student may take private tuition in any subject from any member of the college staff without the written permission of the Principal. All such tuitions must be discontinued one week before the examinations.

14. The General Assembly is the most important part of the college day. Every student should be present to begin the day with prayer to God, and listen to the important announcements. At the first bell all must gather on the assembly grounds for the Assembly where they will pray in common and thereafter move silently to their classrooms.

15. They should be friendly, courteous and cooperative towards other students of the college, treating everyone with respect and conducting themselves in a dignified manner.

16. All must come to college on time, neatly dressed with lessons well prepared and home work done. Text and exercise books and material for drawing, S.U.P.W., art and craft, should be brought to school according to the day's routine.

17. Students are to attend the school in Complete and clean uniform, short and combed hair, clean shaven, polished shoes and trimmed nails.

18. They should be obedient and loyal to the college and the teachers. They should desist from making derogatory comments against the college and teachers on social media.

19. Any pupil who is persistently insubordinate or repeatedly and willfully mischievous or is guilty of other malpractices in connection with examinations or has committed an offence of serious indiscipline/misbehavior or who in the opinion of the Principal, has an unhealthy influence on his fellow students, may be suspended for a specified period or expelled permanently from the college.

20. A student may also be expelled permanently from the college for assaulting a teacher, seriously attacking a fellow student, persistent rude behavior towards teacher and in the opinion of the principal has a demoralizing influence on fellow students, persistent rude behavior towards teacher and in the opinion of the Principal has a demoralizing influence on fellow students.

21. Students repeatedly coming late or forgetting to bring books or coming without the proper uniform may be sent home

# GRIEVANCE AND REDRESSAL

## STUDENT GRIEVANCES REDRESSAL COMMITTEE 2025-26

As suggested by University Grants Commission, New Delhi, the College has established an Grievance Redressal Cell, to provide a mechanism for redressal of students' grievances and ensure the transparency in admission, and prevention of unfair practices, etc. The function of the cell is to look into the complaints lodged by any student, and judge its merit. The Grievance cell is also empowered to look into matters of harassment. Anyone with a genuine grievance may approach the department members in person, or in consultation with the officer in-charge Grievance Redressal Cell. In case the person is unwilling to appear in self, grievances may be dropped in writing at the letterbox/ suggestion box of the Grievance Cell at Administrative Block. Grievances may also be sent through e-mail to the officer in-charge of Student's Grievance Cell.

### **Objective:**

The objective of the Grievance Cell is to develop a responsive and accountable attitude among all the stakeholders in order to maintain a harmonious educational atmosphere in the institute.

A Grievance Cell should be constituted for the redressal of the problems reported by the Students of the College with the following objectives:

Upholding the dignity of the College by ensuring strife free atmosphere in the College through promoting cordial Student-Student relationship and Student-teacher relationship etc.

Encouraging the Students to express their grievances / problems freely and frankly, without any fear of being victimized.

Suggestion / complaint Box is installed in front of the Administrative Block in which the Students, who want to remain anonymous, put in writing their grievances and their suggestions for improving the Academics / Administration in the College.

Advising Students of the College to respect the right and dignity of one another and show utmost restraint and patience whenever any occasion of rift arises.

Advising all the Students to refrain from inciting Students against other Students, teachers and College administration.

Advising all staffs to be affectionate to the Students and not behave in a vindictive manner towards any of them for any reason.

Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited in and outside the institution. Any violation of ragging and disciplinary rules should be urgently brought to the notice of the Principal.

**Scope:**

The cell will deal with Grievances received in writing from the students about any of the following matters:-

Academic Matters: Related to timely issue of duplicate Mark-sheets, Transfer Certificates, Conduct Certificates or other examination related matters.

Financial Matters: Related to dues and payments for various items from library, hostels etc.

Other Matters: Related to certain misgivings about conditions of sanitation, preparation of food, availability of transport, victimization by teachers etc.

**Functions:**

The cases will be attended promptly on receipt of written grievances from the students. The cell formally will review all cases and will act accordingly as per the Management policy.

The cell will give report to the authority about the cases attended to and the number of pending cases, if any, which require direction and guidance from the higher authorities.

**Procedure for lodging complaint :**

The students may feel free to put up a grievance in writing/or in the format available in the admin dept. and drop it in boxes.

The Grievance Cell will act upon those cases which have been forwarded along with the necessary documents.

The Grievance Cell will assure that the grievance has been properly solved in a stipulated time limit provided by the cell.
